



## LINEAR SPINE AMENITY CONCEPT

Centrally located, this space spans the entire site from east to west. To accommodate changes in elevation, it incorporates a retaining wall. The wall is designed so that it doesn't appear as a monolith. It changes direction, varies in height and uses quality coloured and texture concrete units. Flanked by rows of trees, it will have a very subdued character when viewed at a distance.

Amenity consists of both a formal family node to the east and west (group seating, grass play) and natural experiences to the centre, creating a biodiversity connection across the site. There is open space both above and below the wall.
